What pulled America into the War

- Unlimited Submarine (u-boat) warfare
- The sinking of the Lusitania
- British passenger ship carrying American citizens
- May 7, 1915- The ship is torpedoed by a German U-boat
 - 124 Americans die
- Sunk because the Germans believe it is carrying war supplies
- Sussex Pledge is broken
- The Zimmerman Telegram

Unlimited Submarine (u-boat) warfare

According to international law civilian ships must be warned before sinking - allowing for passengers to escape to safety.

Germany was not doing this

The Sinking of the Lusitania

- British passenger liner that set sail from New York carrying American citizens.
- It was sunk without warning on May 7, 1915 off the coast of Ireland
- 1,198 lost; 128 US citizens^C
- Germans claimed the Lusitania was carrying contraband (war materials: guns, ammunition...)

William Jennings Bryan- Secretary of State

"Expressions of regret and offers of reparation in the case of the destruction of neutral ships sunk by mistake, while they may satisfy international obligations, if no loss of life results, cannot justify or excuse a practice, the natural and necessary effect of which is to subject neutral nations and neutral persons to new and immeasurable risks."

• "The Imperial German government will not expect the government of the United States to omit any word or any act necessary to the performance of its sacred duty of maintaining the rights of the United States and its citizens and of safeguarding their free exercise and enjoyment."

RESULT of the Sinking of the Lusitania

- Germany despite promises sunk another ship The Sussex, killing 2 Americans
- President Wilson protested & Germany issued the Sussex Pledge - not "to sink merchant or passenger ships without warning and without saving human lives"

Anti-War Sentiment at home

News of the brutal trench warfare in Europe leads many Americans to protest US involvement in Europe despite Lusitania incident

- Presidential Election of
 - Sitting President Woodrow Wilson runs his campaign with the slogan "He kept us out of the war"
 - Wins reelection with his neutrality stance
- Has the US actually been neutral since the war has started though?

Sussex Pledge

The Sussex Pledge broken: February 15 4917 Germany continued unlimited submarine warfare

Zimmerman Telegram

- March 1917 The Zimmermann telegram released
- If the U.S. entered War against Central Powers, Mexico should attack the U.S. and receive as a reward: Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona.

•AMERICANS WERE OUTRAGED!!!

TELEGRAM RECEIVED. tor 1-8-58 State Dept. foll / white 2nd from London # 5747. Pd 27.1951

"We intend to begin on the first of February unrestricted submarine warfare. ~ We shall endeavor in spite of this to keep the Chited States of america neutral. In the event of this not succeeding, we make Mexico xa proposal of alliance on the following basis: make war together, make peace together, generous financial support and an understanding on our part that Mexico is to reconquer the lost cerritory in Texas, New Mexico, and arizona. The settlement in detail is left to you. You will inform the President of the above most . secretly as soon as the outbreak of war with the UnDied States of America is certain and add the Suggestion that he should, on his own initiative. be Japan to immediate adherence and at the same time mediate between Japan and ourselves. Please call the President's attention to the fact that the ruthless employment of our submarines now offers the prospect of compelling England in a few months to make peace." Signed, ZIEEEEEAEE.

To the German Minister to Mexico

Berlin, January 19, 1917

On the first of February we intend to begin submarine warfare unrestricted. In spite of this, it is our intention to endeavour to keep neutral the United States of America.

If this attempt is not successful, we propose an alliance on the following basis with Mexico: That we shall make war together and together make peace. We shall give general financial support, and it is understood that Mexico is to reconquer the lost territory in New Mexico, Texas, and Arizona. The details are left to you for settlement...

You are instructed to inform the President of Mexico of the above in the greatest confidence as soon as it is certain that there will be an outbreak of war with the United States and suggest that the President of Mexico, on his own initiative, should communicate with Japan suggesting adherence at once to this plan; at the same time, offer to mediate between Germany and Japan. Please call to the attention of the President of Mexico that the employment of ruthless submarine warfare now promises to compel England to make peace in a few months.

Ludendorff's Offensive

- Final German Offensive Attack
- March-April 1918
- All out German attack in the attempt to capture Paris
- American troops arrive and provide aid for the ailing British and French troops
- Germans stopped about 75 miles from Paris Jon Paris
- About 270,000 German causalities

100 Days Offensive

- Allied counter-offensive
- Allies simply outmatch and outmuscle the weakened German troops
- Germans are pushed back into German territory
- Germany no longer able to launch a successful offensive attack

America Declares War

April 2, 1917

President Wilson asked Congress for a declaration of war

April 6, 1917 US Congress declares war!! WW I course changes and Germany routed
